



### 1. December 2004-January 2005 DSS Newsletter Available

The Decision Support Office has issued *DSS Matters* for December 2004-January 2005. The newsletter includes notice that the DSS Monthly Program Cost Report (MPCR) has officially replaced the Cost Distribution Report (CDR). ### 2. Implementation of RAI/MDS in Specified SCI Units

On January 6, 2005, the Office of Patient Care Services issued an Information Letter (IL 11-2005-001) entitled "Implementation of the RAI/MDS on LTC-SCI Units." It reported that Resident Assessment Instrument/Minimum Data Set (RAI/MDS) data collection is underway in two of the four VA Spinal Cord Injury (SCI) units that are surveyed under Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations (JCAHO) Long-Term Care (LTC) standards. That is, SCI-LTC units in VISNs 1 and 12 are submitting RAI/MDS data, and the units in VISNs 3 and 6 will begin submitting RAI/MDS assessments pending completion of staff training. ### 3. Means Test Thresholds for Calendar Year 2005

VHA Directive 2004-071, dated December 17, 2004, revises the Means Test Thresholds, Medicare Deductible Rate, and Child Income Exclusions for calendar year 2005. As the directive states, "Below the Means Test Threshold" is defined as those veterans whose attributable income and net worth are such that they are unable to defray the expenses of care and therefore are not subject to copayment charges for hospital and outpatient medical services."
