



### 1. DSS National Data Extract Data Issues

In communication with VIREC, the Decision Support Office (DSO) has identified two known problems with data in the DSS National Data Extracts (NDE). Researchers should be aware that:

- Records in the Lab Results (LAR) datasets do not reflect specimen type. For example, a calcium test result is reported without indication of the specimen type, be it plasma, spinal fluid, or another. This is true also of results labeled "Serum Creatinine," which is a misnomer, as the specimen type cannot be assumed to be serum. DSS does not currently collect or post specimen type. This will be corrected in FY2007. In the meantime, VIREC recommends that researchers using the LAR data determine if VistA includes a specimen type field for a particular test result. If the specimen type is specified in VistA, it is possible that the laboratory result in the LAR dataset cannot be used.
- The Division field value in NDE Outpatient dataset is not reliable in the current run (FY2005 only). The error has been remedied and will be fixed in the FY2005 third quarter run. Users are reminded that all DSS NDEs are cumulative year-to-date, so this error will be corrected for all FY05 records in the next run.

### 2. New NPCD Online Service

The National Patient Care Database (NPCD) has announced "BioSense VHA Patient Lookup." This new service provides demographic information in response to a user's entry of a patient or encounter ID. The service can be accessed on the VA Intranet Web site at [REDACTED].

### 3. Determination of Combat Veteran Eligibility

VHA Directive 2005-020, "Determining Combat Veteran Eligibility," was issued June 2, 2005. The directive specifies the criteria used to determine if a veteran's service meets the requirements of the VHA policy to provide full medical benefits for two years to recently discharged veterans who served in a theater of combat operations or in combat against a hostile force during a period of hostilities.
